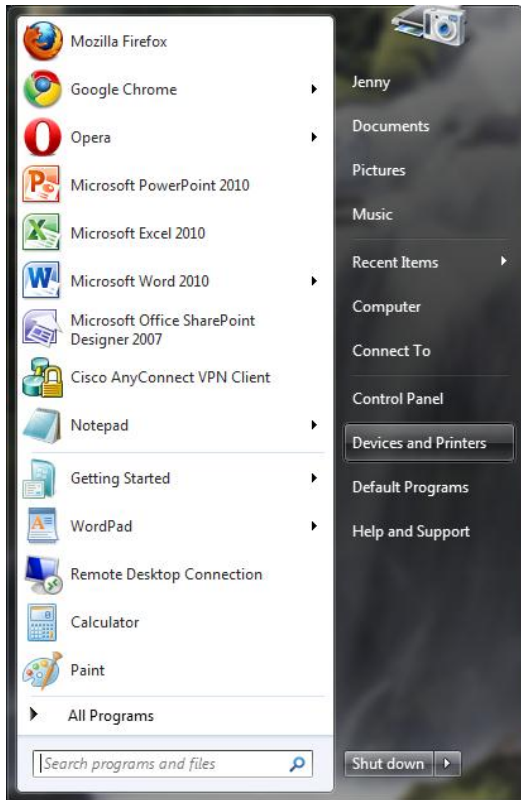


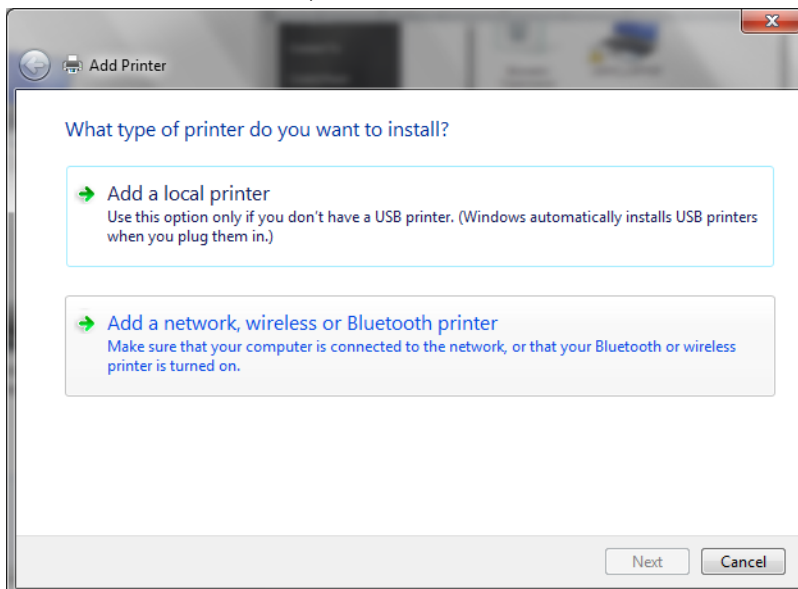
How to Connect to a Printer Wirelessly

In Windows 7

- 1) Connect your printer to the internet by running an ethernet cable from the printer to your wireless modem (Linksys, etc)
- 2) on your computer navigate to **Devices and Printers** in the Start Menu & Click **Add a printer**

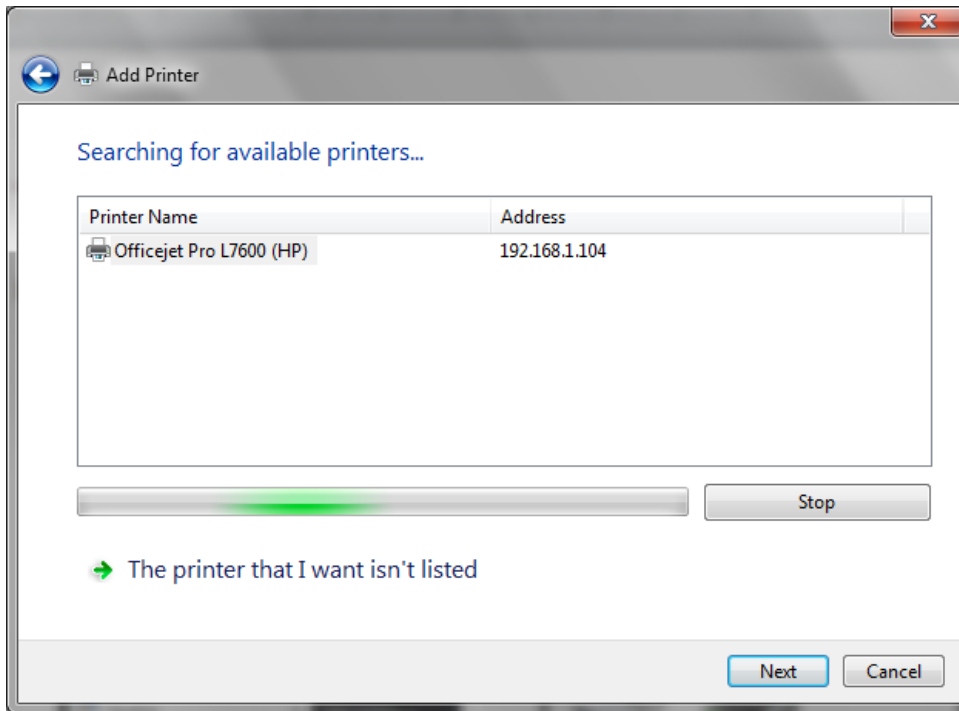


- 3) Select **Add a network, wireless or Bluetooth Printer**

4) It should detect your home printer, if so select the printer & click next

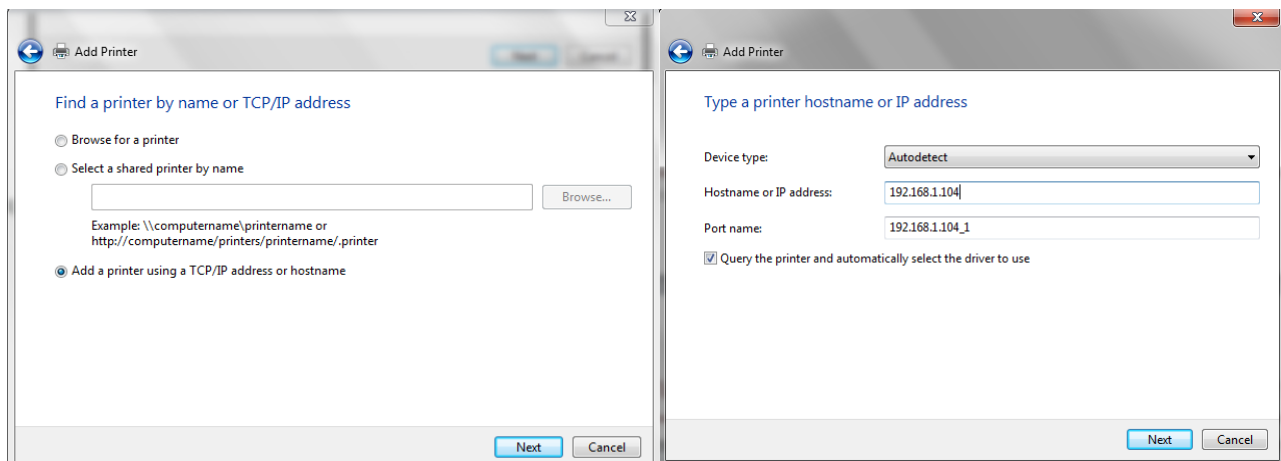


If you're searching for a printer on a large network, it's often easier (& faster) to search for the printer based on its IP address.

To do this, instead of waiting for the printer to be found click the "The printer that I want isn't listed" option above.

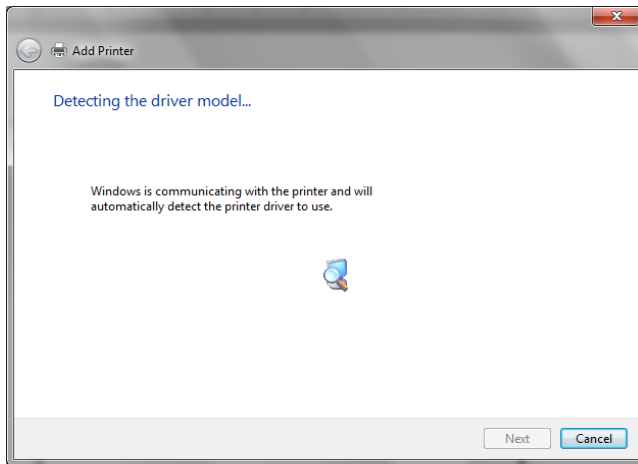
Select the "Add a printer using a TCP/IP address or host name" & click Next.

Enter in the IP address for the printer under "Hostname or IP address" & click Next.

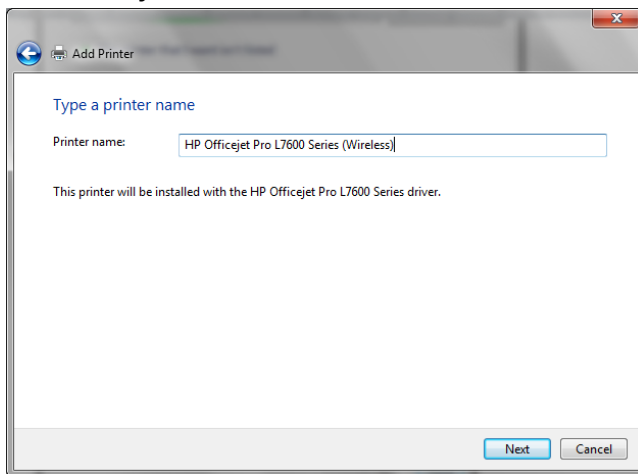

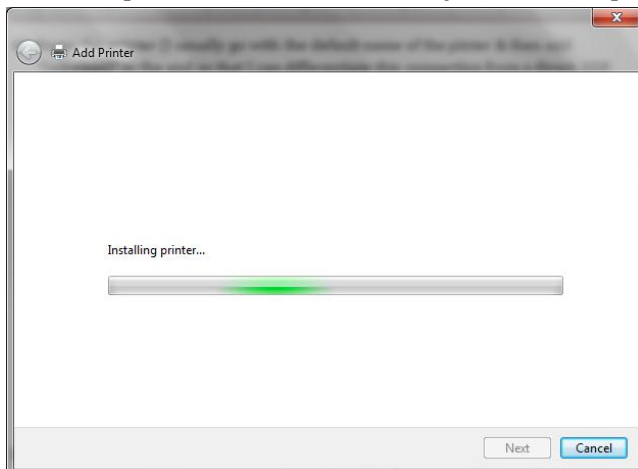
5) Windows will automatically search for the best driver



6) Name the printer (I usually go with the default name of the printer & then add "(wireless)" to the end so that I can differentiate this connection from a direct, USB connection later if necessary, then click Next

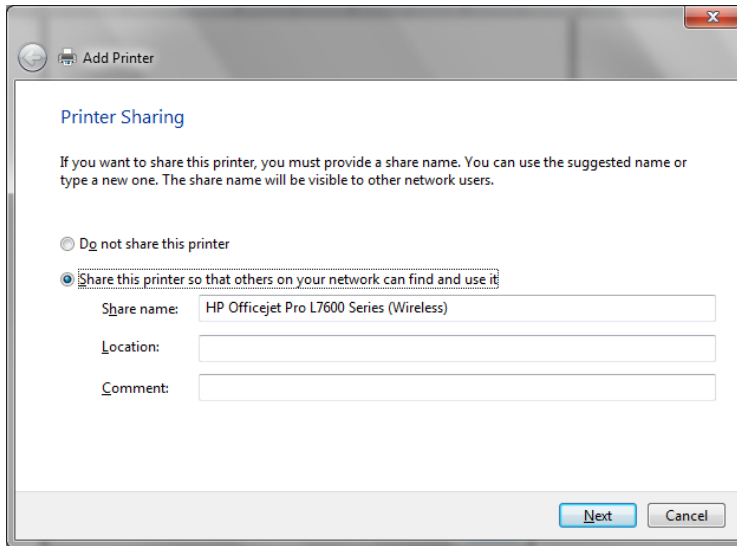


7) The computer will automatically install the printer

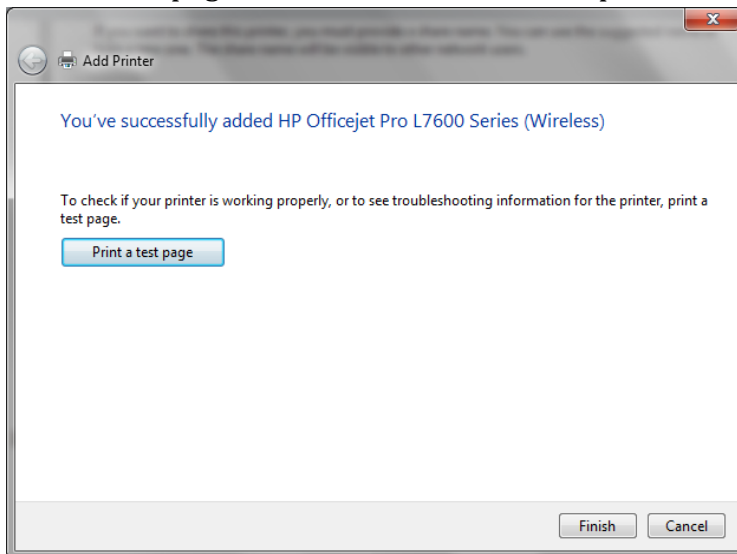


How to Connect to a Printer Wirelessly

- 8) Choose whether or not you want to share the printer with others on your network, then click Next



- 9) Print a Test page to make sure the wireless printer connection is working



- 10) If the page prints, then click Finish & you're all set

- 11) Your Printer should now appear in the Devices and Printers screen
